

Statement of Conditions

Program cost and minimum number of participants: **\$3,175**, based on a minimum of **20** paying participants. **\$3,425**, based on a minimum of **15** paying participants. *Based on exchange rates and tariffs in effect as of September 29, 2011; subject to change in the event that there is a fluctuation of more than 4%.*

Air transportation: **NO AIR ARRANGEMENTS.** If participants wish assistance in arranging their air travel, please contact Seminars International.

Surface travel/transfers: By private deluxe motorcoach as indicated in the itinerary; Barcelona/Seville 1st class rail travel.

Accommodations and meals: Twin occupancy at 4-star hotels as indicated or similar with buffet breakfast daily and four group dinners. **Single Supplement: \$735***

Program arrangements: As indicated in the itinerary, including entrance fees for guided touring where applicable; services of professional English-speaking guides for all tours; tour related gratuities (drivers, guides, included meals). **NOTE: Participants with special needs may incur surcharges for additional services. Handicap accessibility varies significantly from country to country. Participants are responsible for ensuring that they meet passport and visa requirements of each country visited. If required, passport and visa information must be received by Seminars International 45 days prior to departure; late information will result in additional fees.**

Payment schedule: \$750 per person due with enrollment by **January 20, 2012**; balance due **February 27, 2012** upon receipt of invoice.

Cancellation and refund policy: Should cancellation occur prior to 90 days before departure, the initial deposit will be refunded less a \$100 fee per person. The following specified costs are non-refundable: 60-89 days: full deposit; 46-59 days: 50% of program price; 15 - 45 days: recoverable costs only (possible forfeiture of entire program cost); cancellations received less

than 15 days from departure will receive no refund. Cancellations must be submitted in writing; the date such notification is received by Seminars International, Inc. is the cancellation date. Trip cancellation insurance is strongly recommended.

Exclusions: Items not listed above, including but not limited to meals other than those indicated; beverages except at breakfast; optional entertainment and excursions; excess baggage charges; all personal items, such as telephone calls, laundry expenses, individual room service; insurance (brochure available through Seminars International); non tour-related gratuities; departure taxes (except U.S.); passport and visa fees. Most countries require passports to be valid up to six months after the scheduled return.

The airlines or commercial carriers concerned are not to be held responsible for any acts, omissions, or events during the time the passengers are not on board their planes or conveyances. The passage contracts in use by the airlines concerned, when issued, will constitute the sole contract between the airlines and the purchaser of this program and/or passenger.

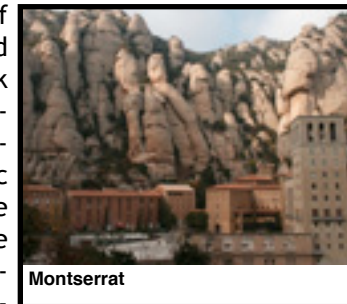

Friday, April 27 - Barcelona Arrival. Arrive in Barcelona on your own arrangements and meet at Silken Gran Hotel Havana for check-in. Join your fellow travelers for a welcome group dinner at a local restaurant. (D)

Saturday, April 28 - Barcelona. Full-day guided tour of the city, including the Picasso Museum, Cathedral of the Holy Cross and Saint Eulalia, Gothic Quarter, 1992 Olympic sites and the Columbus Monument. (B)

Sunday, April 29 - Barcelona. Morning departure for a guided visit of Montserrat. Situated atop an unusual rock formation, Montserrat is very popular among Catholic pilgrims who come from far and wide to see the Black Madonna. Enjoy an afternoon Boy's Choir concert at the Basilica prior to returning to Barcelona. (B)

Monday, April 30 - Barcelona. Morning guided tour of Gaudi sites, including Parc Guell, Casa Batlló and La Sagrada Familia. Free afternoon for independent exploration. (B)

Tuesday, May 1 - Barcelona/Seville. Morning transfer to Sants Station for the AVE fast train to Seville. Arrive at Santa Justa Station and transfer to Doña Maria Hotel. Enjoy a group dinner. (B,D)

Wednesday, May 2 - Seville. Depart for a morning guided walking tour including the Cathedral, Giraldo Tower and Alcazar Palace. Construction of the Alcazar was started in AD 913.

Because of its beauty it was chosen as residence by many monarchs in the centuries that followed. It now is the residence of His Royal Majesty Juan Carlos when in Seville. Enjoy your afternoon free for independent exploration. (B)

Thursday, May 3 - Seville/Ronda. Morning departure by private motorcoach to Ronda, one of the white hill towns, with en route visits to Arcos de la Frontera and Grazalema. Overnight at Hotel Husa Reina Victoria. Group dinner at a local restaurant. (B,D)

Friday, May 4 - Ronda/Marbella. Morning guided tour of the city famous for its spectacular cliffs and bullfighting, prior to departing for Marbella for check-in at Hotel Fuerte Miramar Spa. (B)

Saturday, May 5 - Marbella. Motorcoach tour to Granada to see the Alhambra. Mohammed I, the first king of the Nasriden converted a 9th-century castle into his private royal residence, and it is this which we now know as the Alhambra. The structure is renowned for its stunning frescoes and interior detail. The building is one of the finest examples of Moorish architecture in the world and is among Europe's most-visited tourist attractions. Say 'Adiós' to Spain with a farewell dinner at a local restaurant. (B,D)

Sunday, May 6 - Marbella. Check out of hotel after breakfast for travel home or to your next destination. (B)
